GENERAL JOB DESCRIPTION

The School of Arts & Department of Humanities, Tiffin University, is seeking applications for a full-time position for Professor of English and Technical Writing to begin in August 2018. Appointment requires residence in the Tiffin, Ohio geographical area. Appointment will be at a rank commensurate with academic education, training, and experience.

MAJOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITES

The position requires the ability to teach first year composition courses as well as technical and business writing courses in both face-to-face and online classrooms. The successful candidate must also be able to develop undergraduate and graduate curriculum for both seated and online courses. Because Tiffin University's mission is to educate students by linking knowledge to professional practice, the successful candidate will also guide students in learning writing and research skills as they apply to coursework within academia and to the practical application of skills in the professional world.



Responsibilities include a 4/4 teaching load. Summer Semester teaching assignments are additional contracts and are awarded based on School need. The position requires active participation in program outcome assessments in both the General Education Program and the writing programs, student academic advising, and/or other duties assigned.

Design, administer, and grade course assignments, essays and exams to assess achievement of course objectives as identified by the syllabus. Plan effectively for classes and student success. Actively engage with students in the learning process. Work with the Division Chair/Program Chair to ensure instructional and program quality. Contribute to program development through collaborative participation in curriculum design and review, promotion of collaborative partnerships and engaging with faculty, adjuncts, and/or students in joint projects. Responsible for ensuring that assigned tasks are completed in compliance with various institutional and regulatory requirements. Maintain a professional and courteous attitude at all times towards co-workers, internal and external customers, representing Tiffin University, its programs, policies and procedures in a positive and professional manner. Maintain effective working relationships to ensure institution-wide teamwork. Attend provided/necessary trainings and other meetings to support effectiveness within the position as required.
